



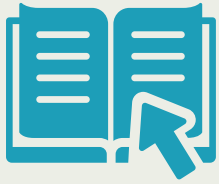
Child Protection in Emergencies (CPIE) Fundamentals

The CPIE Fundamentals course aims to equip child protection staff with the fundamental competencies to be part of initiating, designing and implementing a CPIE response in their context.

Created in collaboration with Save the Children and the **Alliance for Child Protection in Humanitarian Action** Learning and Development Working Group, this facilitated course is sector-facing, typically involving participants from UN agencies, INGOs and national organisations, including government, with a particular focus on the latter.

The course is delivered by our regional teams to target countries or responses on demand, typically in collaboration with key Child Protection actors and coordination mechanisms and the Alliance for Child Protection in Humanitarian Action.

The course is delivered to cohorts of 25-30 learners, as an intensive week-long in-person training or as a less intensive remotely facilitated training over a period of 2-3 months, depending on the needs of the context.



The course involves some pre-work (through **CPiE Entry-level Online** and/or CPMS e-learning modules or document pre-reads) and typically involves 35-50 hours of learning. It uses content from the Alliance for Child Protection in Humanitarian Action's Learning Toolkit along with other CPiE content depending on the contextual needs identified.
